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The European Medicines Agency,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/51/2008 issued on 20 July 2008, the decision P/151/2010 issued on 16 August 2010, and the decision P/289/2011 issued on 2 December 2011,

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Novartis Europharm Limited submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 26 March 2012 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/51/2008 issued on 20 July 2008, the decision P/151/2010 issued on 16 August 2010 and the decision P/289/2011 issued on 2 December 2011.

The application for modification proposed a waiver instead of the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 16 April 2012.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends, as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to refuse the changes proposed by the applicant regarding the paediatric investigation plan and the scope of the waiver.

The Icelandic and the Norwegian Paediatric Committee members agree with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the agreed paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver remain unchanged and are set out in the Annex I.
3. The scientific conclusions and the grounds for refusal are set out in the summary report appended to this opinion.

This opinion is forwarded to the applicant and the Executive Director of the European Medicines Agency, together with its annex(es) and appendix.

The subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver and the measures and timelines of the agreed Paediatric Investigation Plan

1. Waiver

1.1. Condition: Treatment of Paget's disease of the bone

The waiver applies to:

- All paediatric subsets;
- for solution for infusion, intravenous use;
- on the grounds that the disease or condition for which the specific medicinal product is intended does not occur in the specified paediatric subset(s).

1.2. Condition: Treatment of osteoporosis

The waiver applies to:

- the paediatric population of than 5 years of age;
- for solution for infusion, intravenous use;
- on the grounds that clinical studies cannot be expected to be of significant therapeutic benefit to or fulfil a therapeutic need of the paediatric population.

2.1. Condition: Treatment of osteoporosis

2.1.1. Indication(s) targeted by the PIP

Treatment of children at risk for glucocorticoid-induced osteoporosis.
