What is this Joint Task Force?



- At Variations Workshop in June, 2014 Industry presented various on-going issues with variations and proposed possible solutions.
- As part of the proposed solutions, an appeal was made for CMDv to work jointly with industry to find workable solutions that could help all involved.
- After the workshop, a suggestion was offered to consider a "small" work group rather than the full workshop format – goal to be more efficient.
- Industry considered this idea and officially proposed it to CMDv.
- CMDv agreed and the Joint task Force (JTF) was formed.

Plans for the JTF



- Initial Meeting face-to-face
- Subsequent Meetings and JTF work electronically
- Additional face-to-face meetings as necessary

- Consider proposed topics/issues
- Work out possible solutions
- Take possible solutions to respective groups for input
- Work out final positions
- Encourage implementation

Possible topics



- Simplified process for administrative changes (especially for changes impacting multiple products)
- Reduce requirements and avoiding additional administrative burden
- Explore possibility for single (umbrella) variation concept to combine several/many variations into one
 - Topics were based on the initial proposals presented by industry at the Variations Workshop
 - Chosen based on input from both sides
 - Combination: areas causing the most burden/areas with the least challenges to finding solutions
