Understanding the EMA website search tool 'browse by use'

The following table provides an approximate correlation between ATC therapeutic groups 1 and 'patients friendly' therapeutic areas established by the EMA secretariat, in collaboration with the Association of the European Self-Medication Industry (AESGP), in relation to **traditional use (TU) indications** found in <u>EU herbal monographs</u> adopted by the Committee on Herbal Medicinal Products (HMPC). Such correlation serves for search purposes on the EMA website. The HMPC does not allocate individual ATC codes to herbal substances with TU indications only.

For monographs covering herbal substances and/or herbal preparations with **well-established use (WEU) indications**, the proposed ATC code for these uses can be found in the monograph's section 5.1 'Pharmacodynamic properties' in the WEU part of the monograph (left column).

Searches by the 'browse by use' function on the EMA website will return a list of herbal substances and herbal preparations with either WEU indication(s), TU indication(s) or both.

The therapeutic areas mentioned in this document refer to the current situation at the date of publication and will be subject to continuous update to reflect the outcome of new assessment works by the HMPC.
