The European Medicines Agency,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Union procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0370/2020 issued on 9 September 2020, the decision EMA/PE/0000181518 issued on 6 December 2024 and the decision EMA/PE/0000242923 issued on 5 May 2025,

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, LIB Therapeutics Inc. submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 21 May 2025 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0370/2020 issued on 9 September 2020, the decision EMA/PE/0000181518 issued on 6 December 2024 and the decision EMA/PE/0000242923 issued on 5 May 2025.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan

The procedure started on 22 May 2025.

Scope of the modification

Some measures of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

A waiver for a new paediatric subset has been added.

The scope of the Paediatric Investigation Plan was amended to include another condition.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan and to the waiver in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Paediatric Committee member of Norway agrees with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

This opinion is forwarded to the applicant and the Executive Director of the European Medicines Agency, together with its annexes and appendix.

Annex I

The subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver and the measures and timelines of the agreed paediatric investigation plan (PIP)

1. Waiver

1.1. Condition:

Treatment of hypercholesterolaemia

The waiver applies to:

- the paediatric population from birth to less than 6 years of age;
- solution for injection, subcutaneous use;
- on the grounds that the specific medicinal product does not represent a significant therapeutic benefit over existing treatments.

1.2. Condition:

Treatment of mixed dyslipidaemia

The waiver applies to:

- all subsets of the paediatric population from birth to less than 18 years of age;
- solution for injection, subcutaneous use;
- on the grounds that the specific medicinal product does not represent a significant therapeutic benefit over existing treatments.

2. Paediatric investigation plan

2.1. Condition:

Treatment of hypercholesterolaemia

2.1.1. Indication(s) targeted by the PIP

Treatment of elevated low-density lipoprotein-cholesterol (LDL-C) in children from 6 to less than 18 years of age with heterozygous familial hypercholesterolaemia or with homozygous familial hypercholesterolaemia.

2.1.2. Subset(s) of the paediatric population concerned by the paediatric development

From 6 to less than 18 years of age.

2.1.3. Pharmaceutical form(s)

Solution for injection

Quality-related studies	Study 1 Development in accordance with the EU Medical Device Regulation (MDR) of a 300mg strength in pre-filled syringe to be delivered via an auto-injector.
Non-clinical studies	Study 2 (LIB003.TX.009) Study to assess the potential maternal and developmental effects of lerodalcibep in pregnant cynomolgus monkeys and their offspring
Clinical studies	Study 3 (LIB003-008) Double-blind, randomised, placebo-controlled study to assess the efficacy, safety and pharmacokinetics (PK) of lerodalcibep in patients from 6 to less than 18 years of age with heterozygous familial hypercholesterolemia (HeFH). Study 4 (LIB003-003) Open-label, randomised, cross-over study to compare efficacy of lerodalcibep with evolocumab in patients from 10 to less than 18 years of age with homozygous familial hypercholesterolemia (HoFH) on stable diet and oral LDL-C-lowering drug therapy. Study 5 (LIB003-007) Open-label extension study to assess the long-term safety, tolerability and efficacy in patients HoFH, HeFH, cardiovascular disease (CVD) or at high risk of CVD on stable diet and oral LDL-C-lowering drug therapy.
