Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Eli Lilly and Company submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 14 October 2021 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0283/2018 issued on 12 September 2018 and the decision P/0130/2020 issued on 15 April 2020.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 22 November 2021.

Scope of the modification

Some measures of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Amendment of the scope of the Paediatric Investigation Plan to exclude the condition, treatment of psoriasis together with related PIP study 3.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Norwegian Paediatric Committee member agrees with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.
