Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the application submitted by Ixodes AG, Zürich on 23 May 2011 under Article 16(1) of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 also requesting a deferral under Article 20 of said Regulation and a waiver under Article 13 of said Regulation,

Having regard to the opinion of the Paediatric Committee of the European Medicines Agency, issued on 16 May 2012, in accordance with Article 18 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006, and Article 21 of said Regulation and Article 13 of said Regulation,

Having regard to Article 25 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006,

Has adopted this decision:

Article 1

A paediatric investigation plan for azithromycin (monohydrate), gel, cutaneous use, the details of which are set out in the opinion of the Paediatric Committee of the European Medicines Agency annexed hereto, together with its appendices, is hereby agreed.

Article 2

A deferral for azithromycin (monohydrate), gel, cutaneous use, the details of which are set out in the opinion of the Paediatric Committee of the European Medicines Agency annexed hereto, together with its appendices, is hereby granted.

Article 3

A waiver for azithromycin (monohydrate), gel, cutaneous use, the details of which are set out in the opinion of the Paediatric Committee of the European Medicines Agency annexed hereto, together with its appendices, is hereby granted.

Opinion of the Paediatric Committee on the agreement of a Paediatric Investigation Plan and a deferral and a waiver

EMA-001145-PIP01-10

Scope of the application

Active substance(s):

Azithromycin (monohydrate)

Condition(s):

Prevention of borreliac infections

Pharmaceutical form(s):

Gel

Route(s) of administration:

Cutaneous use

Name/corporate name of the PIP applicant:

Ixodes AG, Zürich

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 16(1) of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Ixodes AG, Zürich submitted for agreement to the European Medicines Agency on 23 May 2011 an application for a paediatric investigation plan for the above mentioned medicinal product and a waiver under Article 13 of said Regulation.

The procedure started on 13 July 2011.

Supplementary information was provided by the applicant on 24 January 2012. The applicant proposed modifications to the paediatric investigation plan and requested a deferral.



Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the proposed paediatric investigation plan in accordance with Article 17 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:

- to agree the paediatric investigation plan in accordance with Article 18 of said Regulation,
- to grant a deferral in accordance with Article 21 of said Regulation,
- to grant a waiver for one or more subsets of the paediatric population in accordance with Article 13 of said Regulation and concluded in accordance with Articles 11(1)(b) of said Regulation, on the grounds that the disease or condition for which the specific medicinal product is intended does not occur in the specified subset(s) of the paediatric population.

The Norwegian Paediatric Committee member agrees with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the agreed paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

This opinion is forwarded to the applicant and the Executive Director of the European Medicines Agency, together with its annex(es) and appendix.

Annex I

The subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver and the measures and timelines of the agreed Paediatric Investigation Plan

1. Waiver

1.1. Condition: Prevention of borrelial infections

The waiver applies to:

- All subsets of the paediatric population from birth to less than 1 year of age;
- for gel, cutaneous use;
- on the grounds that the disease or condition for which the specific medicinal product is intended does not occur in the specified paediatric subset(s).

2. Paediatric Investigation Plan

2.1. Condition: Prevention of borrelial infections

2.1.1. Indication(s) targeted by the PIP

Prevention of borrelial infections and prevention of Lyme disease (borreliosis) within 72 hours after tick bite has been noticed.

2.1.2. Subset(s) of the paediatric population concerned by the paediatric development

From 1 to less than 18 years of age.

2.1.3. Pharmaceutical form(s)

Gel

Quality	1	Study 1 Development of a gel that can be covered by a patch without compromising efficacy.
Non-clinical	0	Not applicable.
Clinical	2	Study 2 Extrapolation study to extrapolate efficacy of azithromycin from adults to children from 1 to less than 18 years of age who have been bitten by a tick. Study 3 Open-label, multiple dose trial to evaluate safety and tolerability of azithromycin in children from 1 to less than 18 years of age who have been bitten by a tick.
