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The European Medicines Agency,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Union procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0399/2021 issued on 30 September 2021, and the decision P/0189/2022 issued on 10 June 2022,

Having regard to the application submitted by Alexion Europe SAS on 17 November 2022 under Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 proposing changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a waiver,

Article 1

Changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan for ravulizumab (Ultomiris), solution for injection, concentrate for solution for infusion, intravenous use, are hereby accepted in the scope set out in the opinion of the Paediatric Committee of the European Medicines Agency annexed hereto, together with its appendices.

Article 2

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Alexion Europe SAS submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 17 November 2022 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0399/2021 issued on 30 September 2021, and the decision P/0189/2022 issued on 10 June 2022.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 3 January 2023.



Scope of the modification

Some measures of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Paediatric Committee member of Norway agrees with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

- concentrate for solution for infusion, solution for injection, intravenous use;
- on the grounds that the disease or condition for which the specific medicinal product is intended does not occur in the specified paediatric subset(s).

Information provided by the applicant:

Condition(s) and authorised indication(s):

1. Treatment of paroxysmal nocturnal haemoglobinuria (PNH)

Authorised indication(s):

Ultomiris is indicated in the treatment of adult and paediatric patients with a body weight of 10 kg or above with paroxysmal nocturnal haemoglobinuria (PNH):

- in patients with haemolysis with clinical symptom(s) indicative of high disease activity;
- in patients who are clinically stable after having been treated with eculizumab for at least the past 6 months.

2. Treatment of haemolytic uremic syndrome (aHUS)

Authorised indication(s):

Ultomiris is indicated in the treatment of patients with a body weight of 10 kg or above with atypical haemolytic uremic syndrome (aHUS) who are complement inhibitor treatment-naïve or have received eculizumab for at least 3 months and have evidence of response to eculizumab.

3. Generalised myasthenia gravis (gMG):

Authorised indication(s):

Ultomiris is indicated as an add-on to standard therapy for the treatment of adult patients with gMG who are anti-acetylcholine receptor (AChR) antibody-positive.

Authorised pharmaceutical form(s):

Concentrate for solution for infusion
