Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Scioderm, Inc. submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 4 February 2016 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0266/2014 issued on 13 October 2014, and the decision P/0031/2015 issued on 12 February 2015.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 1 March 2016.

Scope of the modification

Some measures and timelines of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
