Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Union procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0174/2012 issued on 27 July 2012, decision P/0256/2014 issued on 1 October 2014, decision P/0328/2016 issued on 2 December 2016, decision P/0137/2019 issued on 17 April 2019, and decision P/0126/2022 issued on 13 April 2022,

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Amicus Therapeutics Europe Limited submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 9 December 2022 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0174/2012 issued on 27 July 2012, the decision P/0256/2014 issued on 1 October 2014, the decision P/0328/2016 issued on 2 December 2016, the decision P/0137/2019 issued on 17 April 2019, and the decision P/0126/2022 issued on 13 April 2022.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 30 January 2023.



Scope of the modification

Some measures of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

The pharmaceutical form was amended.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:

- to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Paediatric Committee member of Norway agrees with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

This opinion is forwarded to the applicant and the Executive Director of the European Medicines Agency, together with its annexes and appendix.

Treatment of Fabry disease.

The waiver applies to:

- all subsets of the paediatric population from birth to less than 2 years of age;
- for capsule, hard, dispersible tablet, oral use;
- on the grounds that clinical studies cannot be expected to be of significant therapeutic benefit to or fulfil a therapeutic need of the paediatric population.
