Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/78/2011 issued on 6 April 2011,

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, LFB Biotechnologies submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 19 April 2012 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/78/2011 issued on 6 April 2011.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan and to the deferral.

The procedure started on 15 May 2012.

Scope of the modification

Some study measures and timelines of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
