Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Boehringer Ingelheim International GmbH submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 11 March 2018 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/114/2009 issued on 15 June 2009, the decision P/0308/2012 issued on 21 December 2012, the decision P/0046/2014 issued on 7 March 2014, the decision P/0163/2014 issued on 16 June 2014, the decision P/0001/2015 issued on 7 January 2015, the decision P/0207/2015 issued on 10 September 2015, the decision P/0324/2016 issued on 2 December 2016 and the decision P/0032/2018 issued on 30 January 2018.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 3 April 2018.

Scope of the modification

Some measures of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Norwegian Paediatric Committee member agrees with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

- on the grounds that the disease or condition for which the specific medicinal product is intended does not occur in the specified paediatric subsets.
