Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0215/2012 issued on 28 September 2012, the decision P/0189/2014 issued on 6 August 2014, the decision P/0335/2014 issued on 22 December 2014, and the decision P/0109/2015 issued on 1 June 2015,

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, CSL Behring GmbH submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 18 June 2015 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0215/2012 issued on 28 September 2012, the decision P/0189/2014 issued on 6 August 2014, the decision P/0335/2014 issued on 22 December 2014, and the decision P/0109/2015 issued on 1 June 2015.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 14 July 2015.

Scope of the modification

Some measures and timelines of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
