Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/124/2011 issued on 7 June 2011,

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Gilead Sciences International Limited submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 15 June 2012 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/124/2011 issued on 7 June 2011.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 11 July 2012.

Scope of the modification

Update of key binding elements with proposal of an age appropriate formulation and consequential changes in the binding elements of some Clinical trials.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:

- to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Icelandic and the Norwegian Paediatric Committee members agree with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

Treatment of human immunodeficiency virus type-1 (HIV-1) infection - pharmacoenhancer for use in combination with antiretroviral agents.
