Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Amicus Therapeutics UK Ltd submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 21 May 2014 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0174/2012 issued on 27 July 2012.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan and to the deferral.

The procedure started on 18 June 2014.

Scope of the modification

Some timelines of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan and to the deferral in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Norwegian Paediatric Committee member agrees with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

1. Waiver

1.1. Condition:

Treatment of Fabry disease

The waiver applies to:

- All subsets of the paediatric population from birth to less than 2 years of age;
- for capsule, hard, powder for oral solution, oral use;
- on the grounds that clinical studies cannot be expected to be of significant therapeutic benefit to or fulfil a therapeutic need of the paediatric population.

Treatment of Fabry disease.
