Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/80/2009 issued on 24 April 2009, the decision P/47/2011 issued on 4 March 2011 and the decision P/0152/2012 issued on 25 July 2012,

Changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan for Pandemic influenza vaccine (H5N1) (split virion, inactivated, adjuvanted) GlaxoSmithKline Biologicals: Purified antigen fractions of inactivated split virion Influenza A/Vietnam/1194/2004(H5N1) like strain used (NIBRG-14) (Adjupanrix), suspension and emulsion for emulsion for injection, intramuscular use, are hereby accepted in the scope set out in the opinion of the Paediatric Committee of the European Medicines Agency annexed hereto, together with its appendices.

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, GlaxoSmithKline Biologicals S.A. submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 24 June 2013 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/80/2009 issued on 24 April 2009, the decision P/47/2011 issued on 4 March 2011, and the decision P/0152/2012 issued on 25 July 2012.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan.

The procedure started on 17 July 2013.

Scope of the modification

Some measures and timelines of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Icelandic and the Norwegian Paediatric Committee members agree with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the paediatric investigation plan and the subset of the paediatric population and the condition covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

This opinion is forwarded to the applicant and the Executive Director of the European Medicines Agency, together with its annexes and appendix.

The subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver and the measures and timelines of the agreed Paediatric Investigation Plan

1. Waiver

1.1. Condition: Prevention of influenza infection

The waiver applies to:

- Newborn and infants from birth to less than 2 months,
- for suspension and emulsion for emulsion for injection, intramuscular use,
- on the grounds that the specific medicinal product is likely to be ineffective.

2.1.1. Indication(s) targeted by the PIP

Active immunisation against H5N1 subtype of influenza A virus in a pandemic situation.

Active immunisation against H5N1 subtype of influenza A virus in a prepandemic situation.

2.1.2. Subset(s) of the paediatric population concerned by the paediatric development

From 2 months to less than 18 years of age.

2.1.3. Pharmaceutical form(s)

Suspension and emulsion for emulsion for injection.

Randomised, open-label study to evaluate the safety and immunogenicity of a prime-boost schedule of the paediatric formulation of H5N1 candidate vaccine administered to subjects aged from 3 years to less than 18 years. Randomised, observer-blind, dose-range study to assess immunogenicity and safety of varying quantities of the Quebec manufactured H5N1 HA antigen (Q-Pan) adjuvanted with varying quantities of AS03 as compared to the reference vaccine dose of 1.9 µg HA with AS03B.
