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The European Medicines Agency,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2006 on medicinal products for paediatric use and amending Regulation (EEC) No. 1768/92, Directive 2001/20/EC, Directive 2001/83/EC and Regulation (EC) No 726/2004¹,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0258/2012 issued on 31 October 2012,

Having regard to the application submitted by Bayer Pharma AG on 19 June 2014 under Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 proposing changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver,

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Bayer Pharma AG submitted to the European Medicines Agency on 19 June 2014 an application for modification of the agreed paediatric investigation plan with a deferral and a waiver as set out in the European Medicines Agency's decision P/0258/2012 issued on 31 October 2012.

The application for modification proposed changes to the agreed paediatric investigation plan and to the deferral.

The procedure started on 16 July 2014.

Scope of the modification

A measure and a timeline of the Paediatric Investigation Plan have been modified.

Opinion

1. The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the application in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report:
 - to agree to changes to the paediatric investigation plan and to the deferral in the scope set out in the Annex I of this opinion.

The Icelandic and the Norwegian Paediatric Committee members agree with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

2. The measures and timelines of the paediatric investigation plan and the subset(s) of the paediatric population and condition(s) covered by the waiver are set out in the Annex I.

This opinion is forwarded to the applicant and the Executive Director of the European Medicines Agency, together with its annexes and appendix.

1. Waiver

1.1. Condition:

Treatment of all conditions contained in the category of malignant neoplasms (except haematopoietic and lymphoid tissue)

The waiver applies to:

- the paediatric population from birth to less than 6 months of age;
- for film-coated tablet and granules for oral use;
- on the grounds that the specific medicinal product is likely to be unsafe.
