Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency²,

Having regard to the application submitted by Bioiberica S.A on 6 March 2008 under Article 13 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended,

Having regard to the opinion of the Paediatric Committee of the European Medicines Agency, issued on 04 June 2008 in accordance with Article 13 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended,

Having regard to Article 25 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended,

WHEREAS:

- (1) The Paediatric Committee has given, a positive opinion,
- (2) It is therefore appropriate to adopt a Decision granting a waiver.

**POSITIVE OPINION OF THE PAEDIATRIC COMMITTEE ON
A PRODUCT-SPECIFIC WAIVER FOR**

Basis for opinion

Pursuant to Article 13 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, Bioiberica S.A. submitted for agreement to the EMA on 06 March 2008 an application for a waiver on the grounds set out in Article 11 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended for the above mentioned medicinal product.

The procedure started on 10 April 2008.

Opinion

The Paediatric Committee, having assessed the waiver application in accordance with Article 13 of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, recommends as set out in the appended summary report: to grant a waiver for all subsets of the paediatric population and all above mentioned conditions in accordance with Article 11(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1901/2006 as amended, on the grounds that the disease or condition for which the specific medicinal product is intended occurs only in adult populations.

The Norwegian Paediatric Committee member does agree with the above-mentioned recommendation of the Paediatric Committee.

This opinion is forwarded to the applicant and the Executive Director of the Agency.
