The totality of the data from Cohort 1 and Cohort 2 of the CULTIVATE sub-study 1 (SS1), the placebo-controlled, dose-ranging Phase 2 induction study in adults, indicated that etrasimod does not have sufficient induction treatment benefit in patients with moderately to severely active Crohn's disease (CD) in comparison with placebo.

Given the above, the development of the product for CD is being discontinued globally. The decision to terminate the programme is related to efficacy, and not due to any safety concerns regarding etrasimod or requests from regulatory authorities.
