# Maintenance of the Network of European healthcare professional organisations (HCPOs)




























































- 29 eligible organisations by Dec 2015

## Sustained involvement in core activities (I)


## Comparison of involvement as committee / WP members, experts and representatives of organisations

#### **Review of safety communications and DHPCs**
