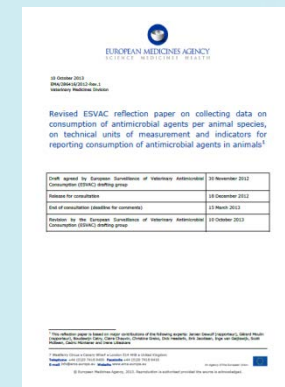

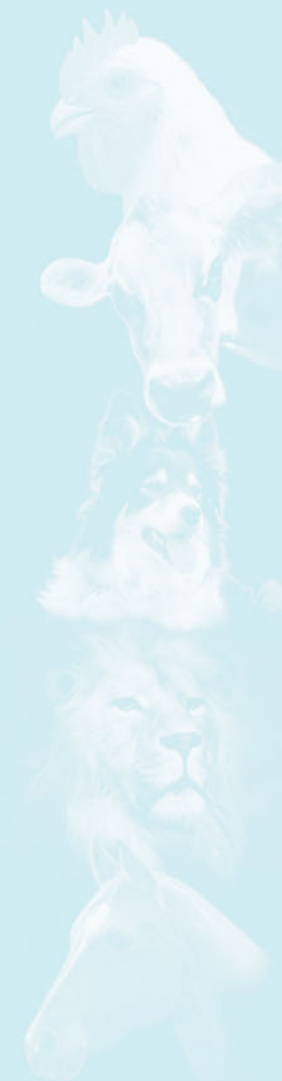

- IFAH-Europe sees the final goal as transparency at the use phase as a means of ensuring responsible use



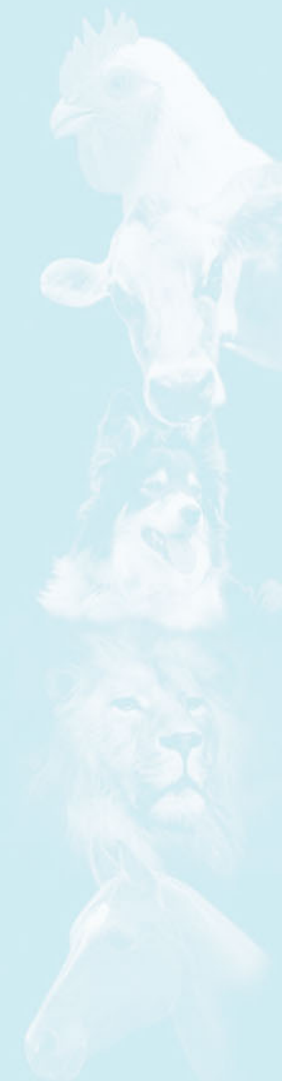
# Revised ESVAC Discussion Paper

# Pilot Project

- Maintain agreement with principle
- IFAH-Europe is seeking clarity on protocol
  - All species in 2014?
  - Prioritise poultry due to simplicity of data collection



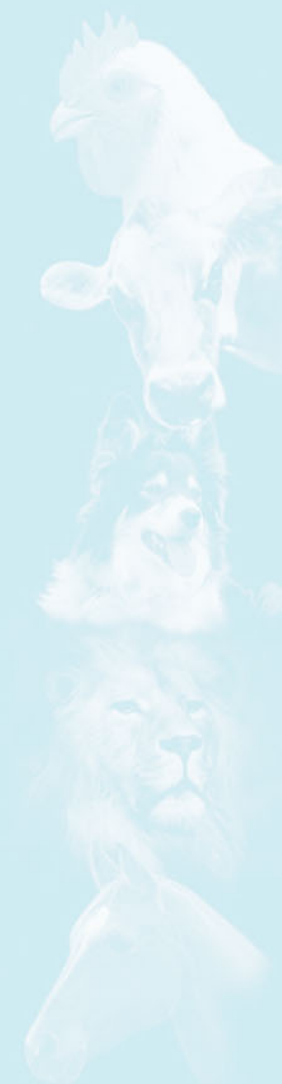
# Collection of Data

- Transparency at user level is favoured by IFAH-Europe
  - Report data of prescriptions at farm level
  - Ensure cost efficient system is put in place
  - Implementation – need computerisation
  - If veterinary practice, who collects denominator ?
  - Ensure quality control of data entry and process
  - Agree on priority of poultry and pigs
  - Production cycles need consideration?



# Unit of Measurement/Indicators

- IFAH-Europe agrees with the proposed unit of measurements
  - IFAH-Europe favours courses of treatment as the leading indicator
- IFAH-Europe seeks clarity on the usefulness of the following indicator: weight of active ingredient consumed 1000 animals/livestock year
- What is the goal of the analysis of Human use with Animal use?



# New Weights for Animals

- IFAH-Europe agrees with the new weights proposed
- Need to correct historical series based on the new weights
