

Nuffield Council on Bioethics' report: Children and clinical research: ethical issues





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- report looks at the ethics of involving children in research, and at the roles and responsibilities of children, parents/guardians, and professionals
- Central to the report is the idea that, from a young age, children have a role in determining their own lives, and should be seen as active participants in research
- Children and parents should be confident that an invitation to take part in research is a
 'fair offer' where the value of the research, and its risks and benefits, have been
 independently assesse




