- •ii) Development of comprehensive **tool** for measuring healthcare access
- iii) **Pilot-test** of the new tool to each group of stakeholders
- ·iv) **Validation** study in Greece, Bulgaria and Cyprus
- ·v) Comparison of the current situation in healthcare access between the three European countries.





The revamped Health at a Glance: Europe report is the first deliverable of the two-year "State of Health in the EU" cycle. The new publication is more closely aligned with the European Commission Communication adopted in 2014, which defined 'increasing accessibility to health care' as one of the three pillars for an EU agenda for health systems.

The main findings of the "Health at a Glance: Europe 2016" report will be presented by Gaetan LAFORTUNE (Senior Economist in the OECD Health Division). Deputy Director-General of DG SANTE Martin SEYCHELL will elaborate on the objectives of the "State of Health in the EU" cycle, its subsequent deliverables, as well as the broader effort of the European Commission to strengthen country knowledge and boost analytical capacity.

The presentations will be followed by a debate with decision-makers and stakeholders on the contribution of the exercise to identifying policy measures to address barriers to access.

European health systems are struggling to respond to the pressing challenges of ageing populations, cuts in health budgets and rising levels of health inequalities.

At the same time, the EU is facing a critical moment and looking to define its future direction and regain citizens' trust.

While there is an impetus to rethink EU health policy, there is little consensus over the shape or direction it should take.

Goal 3: Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages



Key target: achieve universal health coverage by 2030, including financial risk protection, access to quality essential health-care services and access to safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all
