
Virtual Public Workshop – Patient-Reported Outcomes and Vision Related Quality of Life Questionnaires, September 29, 2023

SEPTEMBER 29, 2023

Purpose: Highlight the importance of patients' perspectives, patient-reported outcomes ("PROs"), and questionnaires to measure visual function and vision-related quality of life ("VFQs") in vision research and clinical care.

Goal: Identify future steps in the development of PROs and VFQs for a variety of ocular conditions and varying degrees of visual impairment.

Patients' Perspectives


