Ongoing public health emergencies (PHEs) –Industry's submissions (1/3)

Monitoring supply/demand for lists of critical medicines under Regulation (EU) 2022/123




Ongoing public health emergencies (PHEs) –Industry's submissions (2/3)

MAHs - Supply data (status as of November 7th, 2022):

Monkeypox

• 2 MAHs submit data set as requested by EMA.



Ongoing public health emergencies (PHEs) –Industry's submissions (3/3)

Conclusions:

- Industry's (supply) data is required to undertake the supply & demand matching exercise
 - COVID-19: ~50% (mostly dexamethasone NAP holders) never submitted data to EMA.
- CAP holders have put contingency measures in place to prevent potential shortages;
- Reports are provided to the MSSG every month;
- EMA in close dialogue with HERA to maximise synergies and prevent duplicative actions.


Next steps:

- EMA is reaching out to MAHs of products in the list of critical medicines for COVID-19 to remind them of their reporting obligations and if necessary to provide dedicated support in the submission process.
- Request for Support from Industry Trade Associations: Liaise with member companies (and National Trades) to raise awareness on incomplete/missing submissions and promote reporting compliance



i-SPOC for MAHs: Update on registration (1/2)

- As of 2 September 2022, all MAHs of products authorised in the Union were required to register an i-SPOC for supply and availability issues.
- The Agency's IRIS platform is used to collect details of i-SPOCs for all MAHs (registration opened on 28 June 2022).
- Weekly trends: registrations plateaued (<10 registrations/week)
- Current figures (as of 16 November 2022):
- Total: 1550 i-SPOC registrations (~37% compliance)
 +4% compared to last ISG meeting (26/09)
 - MAHs with CAP products only = 23 CAP holders
 - MAHs with CAPs & NAPs products = 113 CAP holders
 - MAHs with NAP products only = 1414 NAP holders

i-SPOC for MAHs: Update on registration (2/2)

 Additional planned/ongoing communication activities to raise awareness and promote registration of i-SPOCs on supply and availability in the EU:

Social Media – LinkedIn campaign (ongoing)

Medicine Shortages SPOC Working Party (SPOC WP) – engagement with local pharma companies (ongoing)

NCAs websites – News items on each NCA website in local language (ongoing)

National Trades – dissemination by EU trade associations (planned)

Mandate

Provide input on best solutions to ensure a seamless user experience for submission of data requirements;

Provide input to the template and corresponding external guidance;


Support the on-going activities of EMA in the registration of i-SPOCs for all MAHs in the Union;

Report back to the ISG on the group activities and provide input when relevant to "awareness session" days to Industry and other training related activities.

The group will be in place while **interim IT solutions** are being used for the collection of data from i-SPOC Networks.




- Review EMA survey to Industry on "Awareness and usability of guidance and tools* available to MAHs to comply with reporting obligations"

2nd technical meeting (January 12th)

*EMA has implemented a **short-term IT solution, available from July 2022**, to be used for the electronic submissions during a PHEs/MEs, until the ESMP is deployed in 2025.







Medicines Shortage SPOC Working Party with IT Directors - Feedback



Background

MSSG requested workshop to be held between SPOC WP and NCA IT Directors and Expert Community

Intended aims:

- to create and strengthen a communication channel that is key for the development of ESMP
- to present and discuss the IT activities required for interoperability and accessibility between local systems and the ESMP
- to give Member States an opportunity to share experiences regarding their capabilities for managing shortages of medicines



Medicines Shortage SPOC Working Party with IT Directors - Feedback



Survey conducted in preparation

Survey focused on 5 key areas

- Shortage notifications and monitoring
- Availability of data (stock, demand, prescription and sales)
- Existing IT systems to gather and analyse data
- Marketing status data collection
- ESMP preparedness check-in

Responses received from all EU/EEA member states

- invaluable context to the discussion
- Critically important baseline information for future discussions






Agenda highlights





ESMP: Public Health Emergency/ Major Event




Draft plans for Q4 2022 – to be finalised at next PI Planning




