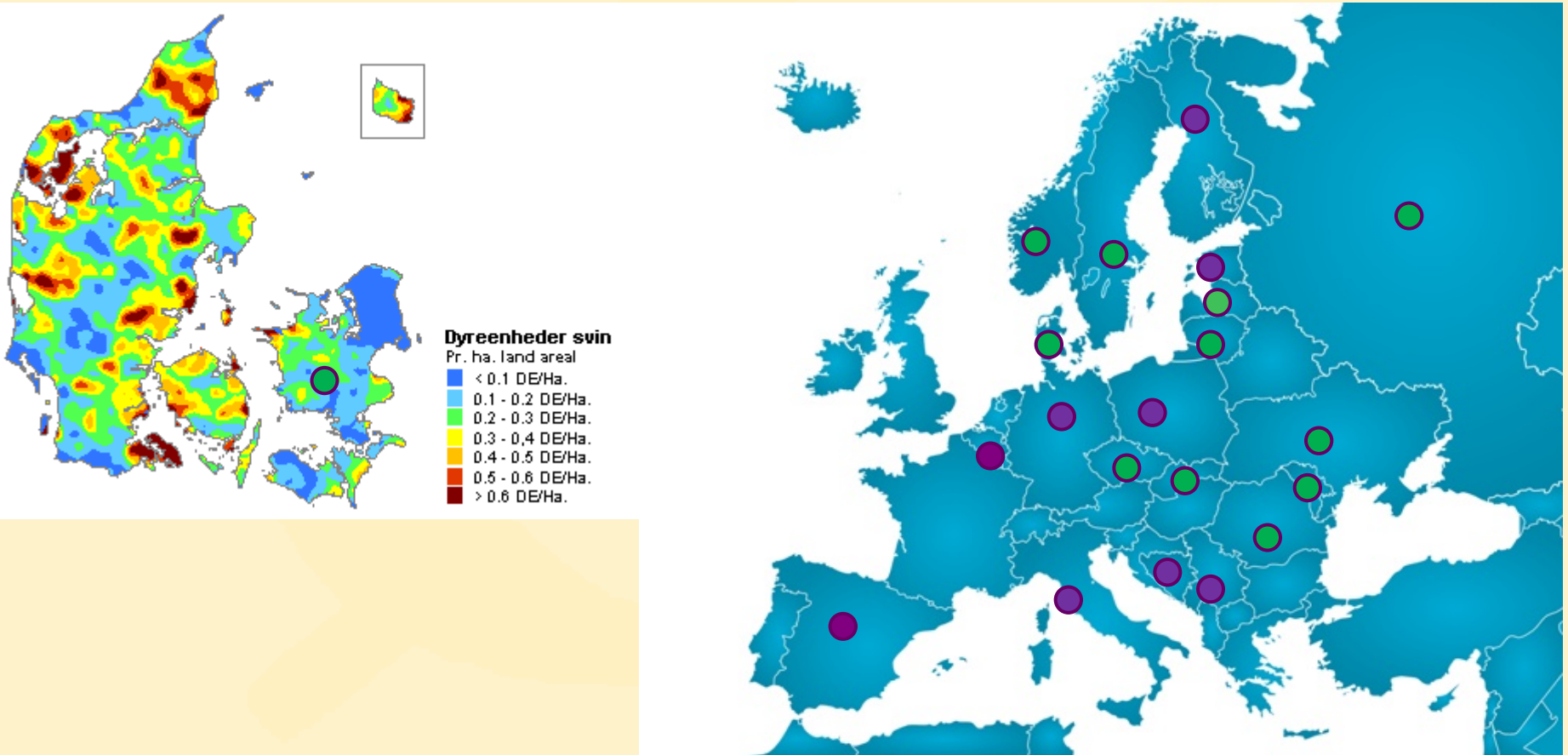

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The current situation

Not many problems with adverse effects

Generally content with current situation

Examples of suspected adverse events

Reported:

Significant visible pathological reaction

Significant visible pathophysiological reaction

Significant lack of efficacy – specific disease

Also important is link between use and event

Examples of suspected adverse events

Not Reported:

Minor visible pathological reaction

Minor visible pathophysiological reaction

Minor lack of efficacy

– specific disease or negative production results

Less obvious link between use and event

Increased information from vets to regulators on adverse effects
