


One of FVE's key policies is the promotion of

At national level by Regulatory Bodies (Chambers, Orders, ..)

Regulatory body, legal base, Access and excercise of the veterinary profession Look upon the quality of vet services from a societal point of view

- Not in all countries separate regulatory body
- Roles and responsibilities
- They give an interpretation of the law, establish standards
- As disciplinary bodies they act upon complaints they receive

- Broad range of ideas and initiatives
- Variable implementation / effectiveness
- Focus on food producing animals (intensive farming)





- Most initiatives on information and promotion of prudent use
- Guidelines for Prudent Use
- Codes of Good Practice
- Promotion of Management: herd health plans, bio security, farm evaluation and audits, farmer-vet relation, bench marking,





Training and Education

- Pre- and post graduate curriculum
- Seminars and conferences
- Special courses to obtain or maintain rights to supply certain categories of medicines
- Courses for farmers (biosecurity, record keeping, storage, administration)





Prescription and dispensing of antimicrobials

- Rights to have a pharmacy and to deliver vmps under condition of extra training, quality assurance schemes,
- Differentiation in categories of antimicrobials (use of certain category only after antibiogram)
- Special conditions for group treatments
- Decoupling prescription and sales: varies from "no", via under discussion, to "yes"





use of antimicrobials

Recordkeeping and central database (pharmacie level, farm level, bench marking)

Difficulties in obtaining information

Private standards, quality schemes: retailers, bio, ..etc

Convenant agreed by all parties on selective and restrictive use of antimicrobials

Much bigger change in the circumstances where under veterinarians work than in the veterinarian as such

- Liberalisation of the market
- Competition at global level
- Pressure on price and margins
- Household budget for food decreased
- Deregulation of the profession
- Etc

→ Big pressure in the market
