Summary of opinion¹ (initial authorisation)

Emtricitabine/Tenofovir disoproxil Krka

emtricitabine/tenofovir disoproxil

On 13 October 2016, the Committee for Medicinal Products for Human Use (CHMP) adopted a positive opinion, recommending the granting of a marketing authorisation for the medicinal product Emtricitabine/Tenofovir disoproxil Krka, intended for the treatment of HIV infection in adults. The applicant for this medicinal product is KRKA, d.d., Novo mesto.

Emtricitabine/Tenofovir disoproxil Krka contains as active substances the antiretrovirals emtricitabine and tenofovir disoproxil (ATC code: J05AR03). The medicine will be available as film-coated tablets (200 mg/245 mg). Emtricitabine and tenofovir are substrates and competitive inhibitors of HIV reverse transcriptase. After phosphorylation, they are incorporated into the viral DNA chain, resulting in chain termination.

Emtricitabine/Tenofovir disoproxil Krka is a generic of Truvada which has been authorised in the EU since 21 February 2005. Studies have demonstrated the satisfactory quality of Emtricitabine/Tenofovir disoproxil Krka, and its bioequivalence to the reference product Truvada. The full indication is:

"Emtricitabine/Tenofovir disoproxil Krka is indicated in antiretroviral combination therapy for the treatment of HIV-1 infected adults".

It is proposed that Emtricitabine/Tenofovir disoproxil Krka be prescribed by physicians experienced in the management of HIV infection.

Detailed recommendations for the use of this product will be described in the summary of product characteristics (SmPC), which will be published in the European public assessment report (EPAR) and made available in all official European Union languages after the marketing authorisation has been granted by the European Commission.
