## Summary of opinion <sup>1</sup> (initial authorisation)

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# Pregabalin Mylan

## pregabalin

On 26 May 2015, the Committee for Medicinal Products for Human Use (CHMP) adopted a revised positive opinion, recommending the granting of a marketing authorisation for the medicinal product Pregabalin Mylan, intended for the treatment of epilepsy and generalised anxiety disorder. The applicant for this medicinal product is Generics (UK) Limited.

Pregabalin Mylan will be available as 25 mg, 50 mg, 75 mg, 100 mg, 150 mg, 200 mg, 225 mg and 300 mg hard capsules. The active substance of Pregabalin Mylan is pregabalin, a gamma-aminobutyric acid (GABA) analogue (ATC code N03AX16). Pregabalin modulates neuronal excitability in the central nervous system.

Pregabalin Mylan is a generic of Lyrica, which has been authorised in the EU since 6 July 2004. Studies have demonstrated the satisfactory quality of Pregabalin Mylan, and its bioequivalence to the reference product Lyrica. The full indication is:

### Epilepsy

Pregabalin Mylan is indicated as adjunctive therapy in adults with partial seizures with or without secondary generalisation.

### Generalised Anxiety Disorder

Pregabalin Mylan is indicated for the treatment of Generalised Anxiety Disorder (GAD) in adults.”

Detailed recommendations for the use of this product will be described in the summary of product characteristics (SmPC), which will be published in the European public assessment report (EPAR) and made available in all official European Union languages after the marketing authorisation has been granted by the European Commission.
