Summary of opinion¹ (post authorisation)

Edarbi

azilsartan medoxomil

On 19 September 2013, the Committee for Medicinal Products for Human Use (CHMP) adopted a positive opinion recommending a variation to the terms of the marketing authorisation for the medicinal product Edarbi. The marketing authorisation holder for this medicinal product is Takeda Global Research and Development Centre (Europe) Ltd. They may request a re-examination of the CHMP opinion, provided that they notify the European Medicines Agency in writing of their intention within 15 days of receipt of the opinion.

The CHMP adopted a new contraindication as follows:

"Concomitant use of azilsartan medoxomil with aliskiren is contraindicated in patients with diabetes mellitus or renal impairment (GFR < 60 mL/min/1.73m²) (see sections 4.4 and 4.5)."

Detailed conditions for the use of this product will be described in the updated summary of product characteristics (SmPC), which will be published in the revised European public assessment report (EPAR), and will be available in all official European Union languages after the variation to the marketing authorisation has been granted by the European Commission.

For information, the full contraindications for Edarbi will be as follows²:

- Hypersensitivity to the active substance or to any of the excipients.
- Second and third trimester of pregnancy (see sections 4.4 and 4.6).
- **Concomitant use of azilsartan medoxomil with aliskiren is contraindicated in patients with diabetes mellitus or renal impairment (GFR < 60 mL/min/1.73m²) (see sections 4.4 and 4.5).**
