Medicine shortages are a global issue and a critical public health challenge that is at the top of the agenda of EU policymakers, regulators and healthcare providers. Shortages impact all medicines with significant consequences for patient care. They can lead to medicine rationing and delay of critical treatments, require patients to use alternative treatments which may be less effective or may increase the risk of medication errors due to unfamiliarity with the new regimen. Many factors contribute to shortages, such as supply chain disruptions, rising demand, regulatory challenges, economic factors, and geopolitical events or emergencies. The COVID-19 pandemic compounded the problem of medicine shortages and EMA implemented several strategies and initiatives to enhance monitoring, improve transparency, and ensure availability of medicines.

Join us for this webinar to learn more about the role of EMA and its network of national competent authorities in the Member States and the European Commission (also known as the EU regulatory network) in managing shortages. We will discuss how we are addressing shortages and what actions you can take to prepare for and help manage them.
